Admission Criteria

The Men's Recovery Home is a residential program serving chemically dependent men who meet the following criteria:

- 18 years of age or older
- A resident of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts
- Willing to authorize a CORI check, CORI report must be without warrants
- Alcohol and drug free
- Medically and psychologically stabilized

Population Served

- Individuals in need of long term treatment for addiction to alcohol and other drugs
- Individuals who are homeless or chronically homeless
- Individuals participating in medication assisted recovery programs
- Individuals with mental health disorders
- Individuals with traumatic head injuries

Services Offered

The Men's Recovery Home offers services for its participants for up to six months. Participants in the Men's Residential Program receive the following services:

- Individual, group and family counseling
- Comprehensive educational components related to all aspects of recovery
- Employment training and placement
- Peer evaluation to encourage interpersonal growth
- 12 Step meetings and other AA/NA recovery related activities
- 24 hour crisis intervention assistance
- Employment training and placement assistance
- Specialty services designed for those living with HIV/AIDS, traumatic brain injuries, and chronic homelessness
- Structured recreational opportunities
- Referrals to community-based collateral services, educational opportunities, medical care, and other forms of assistance
- Housing placement assistance
- Discharge and aftercare planning

Referral Process

Social service agencies are encouraged to refer eligible individuals to the Men's Program 508-674-2788 ext. 102.

- An Initial Referral Form must be completed by a service provider that will be reviewed by program staff for eligibility
- A face to face interview will be scheduled
- Once accepted, the individual will be placed on a waiting list if there are no immediate openings in the program
