Steppingstone's Project ROAR (Re-entering Offenders Achieving Recovery) offers reintegration and recovery services to men transitioning from prison to the community.

## Admission Criteria

To be considered for services you must be:

- 18 years of age or older
- In the Bristol County House of Correction's (BCHOC) Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) unit
- Within 4 months of release into the community
- Possess substance use or co-occurring (substance use and mental health disorder ) disorder

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## ROAR services

ROAR provides services that promote long-term recovery from substance use and co-occurring disorders and reduce recidivism to crime. An Individual Service Plan is tailored around the unique needs of each participant served. Each participant is encouraged and guided in driving the goals and objectives of his treatment plan as he progresses through different stages of recovery.

Services are available to men who will be transitioning from the BCHOC RSAT unit into the community within 4 months. Services will be provided in the correctional setting for up to four months and extend out into the community as long as needed to achieve goals and long-term sobriety.

## Referral Process

Bristol County House of Corrections Re-entry and RSAT unit staff members contact Project ROAR's Coordinator to refer eligible men, after which a face to face intake is scheduled with a ROAR team member within four months of re-entry.
