## Admission Criteria

The Graduate Program provides individuals with a supported independent living experience. To be considered for admission, an individual must meet the following criteria:

- 18 years of age or older
- A resident of Greater Fall River area
- Employed full time or have the ability to meet financial obligations
- Active in recovery and self help programs
- Alcohol and drug free
- Medically and psychologically stabilized

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## Population Served

- Individuals in need of housing and case management support
- Individuals with co-occurring substance abuse and mental health
- Individuals with histories of homelessness

## Services Offered

The Graduate Program offers transitional housing services for its participants for up to one year. Participants in the Fall River Graduate Program receive the following services:

- Comprehensive case management
- Relapse prevention group sessions
- Individual substance abuse counseling
- Independent living skills training
- Employment training and placement assistance
- Health and wellness counseling
- Behavioral and anger management training
- Mental health treatment access
- 12 Step meetings and other AA/NA recovery related activities
- Crisis intervention
- Structured recreational opportunities
- Referral to community-based collateral services, educational, medical care, domestic violence and other forms of assistance
- Housing placement assistance
- Discharge and aftercare planning

## Referral Process

Social service agencies are encouraged to refer eligible individuals to the Graduate Program at 508-674-2788 ext. 118.

- An Initial Referral Form must be completed by a service provider that will be reviewed by program staff for eligibility
- A face to face interview will be scheduled
- Once accepted, the individual will be placed on a waiting list if there are no immediate openings in the program
